## Nursery Curriculum Information

Week Beginning: Monday 1<sup>st</sup> May 2017



Dear Parents

This week in Nursery we have been learning about bees. We have linked this to talking about the fact that some species of bees are endangered for the first time. We have talked briefly about how important bees are, and have been very impressed by some of the children's knowledge. We have continued to practise all the phonic sounds using songs and flashcards, and have talked about '2 letters, 1 sound' in 'bee'. We have not had a key text this week, but have talked about Winnie the Pooh stories linked to talking about honey and bees.

- On Tuesday, we all shared some of our weekend news with a grown up. We had lots of fun travelling in different ways, playing circle games and jumping onto the large crash mats in the sports hall. We enjoyed using our scissor skills to create our own bees. We talked about hexagons and bee hives.
- On Wednesday, the children had a busy morning working and playing in the Nursery. We went for a jog through the woods before lunch and some of us made bee books. Lots of the children painted pictures of Winnie the Pooh with Mrs Bloom. We spent time in the Read Hall during the afternoon, playing circle games and watching a children's programme about Winnie the Pooh.
- On Thursday, we all went swimming in our groups. We enjoyed being outside at lunchtime. During our outside time we had time riding on the bikes and trikes and playing in the Pre Prep playground and Nursery garden using lots of equipment and toys from our sheds. We had music with Miss Skinner in the afternoon. We sang a new song about bees. Lots of us practised writing our names and we looked through the fence at the construction site to see how our new Nursery is progressing.
- On Friday, we had waffles and honey as a special treat. Mrs Bloom brought us Winnie the Pooh's special honey pot and honey twizzler to use. We played a bee game, rolling a die and collecting and counting bees to put into their bee hive, and went for a walk through the woods spotting different wild flowers.

This weekend you may like to support your child's learning by talking about minibeasts, and the phonic sound they begin with, and practise counting carefully to 6 and 8. We have talked about the number of legs that insects and spiders have.

Please could we remind parents that whilst we are very happy for each child to bring a comforter (teddy etc) or a toy in to show linked to a special interest, please could parents discourage children from bringing lots of toys into school.
