What an exciting but short and snowy week in Nursery. Several children were poorly on Monday and Tuesday and we hope that everyone will be feeling much better next week, after some extra days at home due to the snow.

We have talked about the numbers 6 and 16, and practised 'careful counting' each day on the carpet. Our special shape has been a hexagon. Our role play area has continued to be a hospital and some of the children have enjoyed being doctors. We will complete lots of our other planned activities next week.

- On Monday, it was lovely to hear the children share their weekend news. The children enjoyed dance in the Pre Prep hall with Mrs Wilson. Lots of children played outside in the snow during the morning and afternoon which was very exciting. The children visited the Pre Prep library in small groups and created wellie snow prints. We talked about winter and read lots of snowy stories.
- On Tuesday, the children really enjoyed creating black and white collage pictures of hexagons. The new nursery children had music with Miss Skinner. Several children created a giant Brio train track in the quiet room. The children played outside again in the morning and went for a snowy winter walk through the woods in the afternoon.

- Count up to 16 objects carefully for the older children, spot number 6's for the younger children
- Talk about animals that live in very cold places and how they are camouflaged and prepared to live in such cold winter weather
