Dear Parents

We began our week with a prize-giving assembly in celebration of all those children who had entered our Mr Men and Little Miss competition. With 80 entries and everyone receiving recognition, it was quite an occasion! We even enjoyed a short animation of the story of Mr Tickle! On Tuesday morning we all enjoyed a lovely assembly led by Silver Birch class; Thursday brought the whole school together for hymn practice and we enjoyed a whole school assembly on Friday led by Mr Bevington all about working together.

Literacy

This week our key text has been *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* by Eric Carle. The children enjoyed retelling the story in various forms in their Literacy groups. The children have also been learning new digraphs and have practised spotting these in words.

Maths

In maths, we extended our focus on patterns and explored symmetry. The children enjoyed creating symmetrical patterns in a range of ways and all of the children took part in this week's Lego maths challenge. The children had to retell the story of *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* by creating a bar chart on their Lego boards. Then they carefully counted each piece of food. We decided to count a large number in groups of 5s.

Other areas of learning

We have also had some very exciting news this week from the Royal Society. After last year's success with the Bananarium, we have been granted extra funding for this year's Butterfly Project which is due to start next term. This week the children have been thinking about what they would like to learn about butterflies and the children have come up with some very interesting research ideas.

We had our first rehearsal for our Easter production in the Read Hall and the children were thrilled to see the stage ready for our show next week. If your child has had a

slip requesting help with costumes and you are able to do so, please can we have the said items by Monday. In addition, please can you ensure your child has a clean pair of jogging bottoms, as the majority of children will be wearing these during our production.
