The children have enjoyed a fantastic Science Week full of exciting activities, trips, visitors and learning.

### **Monday**

Dr Dee from Mad Science treated us to a light extravaganza as she taught us how colours are formed from white light. We learnt that when light bends, the colours of the rainbow are formed. A highlight of the show was a huge rainbow flame which we viewed through special glasses.

### **Tuesday**

We were blessed with glorious weather for our trip to High Lodge, Thetford. As well as following *The Highway Rat* trail, we explored length (our maths focus for the week) by collecting leaves and twigs and ordering them by size. We were challenged to collect natural items to make a spider picture. In our magical base camp, we shared the story of *The Highway Rat*, enjoyed a picnic lunch and sang camp songs. We were also lucky enough to have time to explore the musical trail.

### **Wednesday**



We also made story maps about *The Highway Rat* and enjoyed watching the animated version in the afternoon. ### **Thursday**

The *Mini Professors* show was the perfect way to round off our space topic and the children really enjoyed learning about the solar system. As the nights draw in over the holidays, you may like to do some star gazing in your gardens at home.

## Friday

We finished our judging of books contending for the Royal Society's Young People's Book Prize. Our winner is Markus Motum's fascinating book about Mars Rover, *Curiosity*.



To celebrate the project, we joined forces with a Year 4 class to make and race Mars Rover models.
