It has been lovely to welcome pupils back after the Christmas holidays and I wish everyone a Happy New Year! Mrs Harries talked about New Year's resolutions in Pre Prep assembly, encouraging children to set positive targets and to keep striving for them even if they did not succeed every day. We also elected this term's new "Top Birds" in Bird Family meetings and we look forward to seeing these children taking on their new responsibilities in the coming weeks.

Headmaster's assembly started with a beautiful waltz, played by Nora Østergaard on her flute. The assembly itself took children through the events leading up to next Tuesday's key Parliamentary vote on the EU Withdrawal Agreement and the unprecedented uncertainty surrounding what may happen next, with only 77 days left before our scheduled departure. We also congratulated the large number of Town Close pupils who have been selected for county cricket sides and Ella Snowling for her part in *Aladdin* at the Theatre Royal, where she has been playing *Yum Yum*. This week I have seen a number of our Year 8 pupils to practise interview skills and it has been a joy to share their hopes and ambitions and see their confidence in discussing a range of issues. I wish those taking senior school entrance assessments in the coming weeks the best of luck. At the younger end of the spectrum, I chatted to our Reception pupils who were busy

searching for a polar bear in the grounds yesterday. They talked enthusiastically about their new project to me in the library today and I am sure they will enjoy their trip to Norwich Castle next Friday when, amongst other activities, they will be going on a bear hunt.



Elsewhere, I saw Year 6 pupils studying the characters in *Macbeth* during their English lessons and Year 4 children practising their inference skills as well as learning how to use a thesaurus effectively. Year 2 children were producing some very impressive writing and starting their Great Fire of London topic. I joined Year 8 pupils testing their scientific understanding with questions set for them by Mr Chapman on a cloud-based iPad application, while Year 3 were learning names and locations of important places in the British Isles. Year 4 children have been rehearsing hard for their production, *Rock Bottom*, which takes to the stage in two weeks' time, and seemed



really to enjoy rehearsing with the sound equipment on Wednesday evening. Meanwhile, Year 7&8 pupils are busy rehearsing their musical *Beauty and the Beast*, to be performed later in the term.

Children in the Prep Department have begun training in this season's sports and next week sees the start of the netball and hockey seasons, with fixtures versus Framlingham Prep. Later this term, we look forward to the traditional house cross-country, as well as fixtures with other schools. It was good to see training in progress during PE lessons on our cross-country course. It has also been great to see children enjoying the six new adventure play areas around it during break times, despite the cold weather, and Reception children also having a lovely time playing on the various apparatus during their explorations of the grounds this week.
