Dear Parents

This week, we enjoyed watching a fantastic assembly performed by Silver Birch class, all about significant people, including our mothers! We also enjoyed a whole school hymn practice on Thursday morning and a whole school assembly, led by Mr Bevington, this morning about the “special powers” we have to help our mothers and those who care for us.

Departing from our exciting topic about Liquids, we kicked off our summer topic with a most spectacular performance of *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*. We were impressed with the children’s behaviour, cooperation and enthusiasm as they worked together to perform an amazing adaptation of Eric Carle’s well known story. This was quite a feat for four and five year olds, as we are sure you will agree.

Literacy

We have been thinking about significant people in our lives, in particular our mummies as we look forward to celebrating Mother’s Day this weekend. The children have written messages in their handmade cards reflecting their special thoughts about loved ones. In literacy groups, the children continued to extend their phonetic knowledge and they all read to their teachers individually or in groups.

Maths

We have been exploring clocks and different times of the day. We were most impressed by the children’s existing knowledge of time. We used the hours of the clock to sequence the school day. The children were challenged to make their own clocks. They combined numeric skills with a bit of design and technology as we worked out how to make the hands rotate around our elaborately decorated clocks.

Games

We enjoyed a carousel of games this week; a member of the Prep Department, Miss Goddard, led one of the activities, musical movement. Other activities included hurdling, throwing and catching, and riding bikes and trikes.
